

ABSTRACT

Abstract is a short explanation about information in a thesis. Writing the abstract involves clear thinking and full expression because abstract is the first part which the reader will read about. The main problem, however, is about the students' difficulties in writing abstract. This study was carried out in STAIN Zawiyah Cot Kala Langsa. This study was qualitative descriptive. The object of research was the graduated students of English department which was taken based on purposive sampling technique. The purpose of this research is to know the students' difficulties, and the factors that cause students faced difficulties in writing abstract. In order to obtain the data needed, the writer conducted questionnaire and interview. Furthermore, the writer analyzed the data by using percentage formula and interactive model to find out the result of this research. The result of this research was the respondents found difficulties in writing abstract. Most of the students found internal and external difficulties in writing abstract. The internal difficulties were in writing components about 65%, length abstract about 75%, and the use of tense in abstract 65%. Meanwhile, the external difficulties were lack of reference about 80% and feeling anxiety about 64%. The result of the last average reached 70% of students faced difficulties. The reasons that cause them faced difficulties were there was no guidance book about how to write abstract well. Moreover, they still confuse in writing abstract because it is the first time they write it and should comprehend their thesis. They do not know the procedure of writing abstract as well. The result proved that they faced difficulties in writing abstract. Based on the research, the researcher suggests that the lecturer needs to give explanation clearly to the students about how to write a good and effective abstract.

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CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

A. Background of the Study

In academic writing, essays, articles, and reviews often begin with a summary, called an abstract. An abstract is a brief summary, a few sentences, that helps researcher to decide whether she/he wants to locate and read the entire article. Writing an excellent abstract is vital to encourage readers to obtain the full paper, read it, and cite it. Writing a good and effective abstract for an article or a thesis is a sub-skill of the writing skill in the field of TEFL as well. Like a paragraph writing for example, it should meet some criteria. The essential components of abstract are the background, the problem, the methods, the results, and the implications of study. According to American Psychology Association (APA) Style, abstract should be interesting and containing all the key words and avoids complex sentences. It is written after the report is completed, although it is intended to be read first. Writing abstract is one of an essential part, which contains of short summary from thesis. It is highly specialized form of academic writing. The abstract of an article, a paper or a thesis is a very important part for the researcher as well as the reader.

Abstract has function and purpose in theses as well. Many abstracts are published without the complete paper itself in abstract journals or in online

databases. Thus, an abstract might serve as the only means by which a researcher determines what information a paper contains. Moreover, a researcher might make a decision whether to read the paper or not based on the abstract alone. Because of this need for self-contained compactness, an abstract must convey the essential results of a paper.³ Thus, an abstract is important because its function is providing the information about the study in the thesis.

Student who had finished their thesis should write and produce a good and effective abstract. To write a good one, students need to comprehend writing the way or technique in producing a good abstract well. Moreover, they should comprehend on the techniques and structure of writing a good abstracts and usually systematically practice this skill during their undergraduate study and graduate study. Nevertheless, the students who had made abstract still could not produce the abstract which reach good criteria of abstract itself when they wrote their abstract. However many writers still find out difficulties in writing effective abstract. For example, as the writer analyzed some graduate students' abstract, most of them made mistake in using tense for abstract. They used "Simple Present Tense" when they are referring to the methodology. In fact, the appropriate tense for methodology or what they did during the research in abstract is "Simple Past Tense". Moreover, others still miss some components of abstract and the length of good and effective abstract. Due to the above discussion, it can be assumed that most of the students still do not understand in writing good and effective abstract.

B. Research Question

- 1. What are the difficulties of graduate students of English department at STAIN Zawiyah Cot Kala Langsa in writing abstract?
- 2. Why do graduate students of English department at STAIN Zawiyah Cot Kala Langsa face difficulties in writing abstract?

C. The Purpose of the Study

- To describe the reason of difficulties of graduate students of English department at STAIN Zawiyah Cot Kala Langsa in writing abstract.

The scope of this research is limited to the description of the difficulties and reason made students difficult in writing abstract.
